

2006 Structural Moving Photo of the Year



On Monday, June 19, 2006, **Jessica Pischer**, serving as a pilot car driver for **North Land Building Movers**, Eureka, South Dakota, stopped her Ford 350 "Dually" on the side of South Dakota State Highway 16-A, walked into the middle of the empty three-lane road with a disposable Kodak camera purchased from Wal-Mart and snapped the photograph you see below.

North Land Movers had departed Hill City, SD school grounds at 5:30 am with the 24' wide x 60' long x 17'8" tall building in order to avoid construction and tourist traffic. The move was down a steep winding hill, through Buckeye Tunnel a distance of 17 miles to a site along Playhouse Road East of Keystone, SD.

The building, used for an after school program by the Hill City School System, was purchased by Marvin & Dolores Mattson. The Mattson's, who live in a log cabin, bought the building to serve as a craft room for their children and additional sleeping rooms for guests.
