### WIDEST STRUCTURE MOVED UNDER \$30,000

Laurie McCulloch Building Moving & Mechanical, Whitby, ON, Canada, moved this frame sales office for Monarch Construction of Toronto, ON, Canada. The structure, 85' W x 82' L, was moved 100' off the original site to allow

for contaminated soil removal then placed back on blocks and pads at the original site. The contaminated soil was the result of munitions being manufactured on the location during World War II.

McCulloch had previously

moved this structure in seven pieces (loads) four years earlier and then reassembled. The move this time was accomplished in one piece since the move was on site. **SM**

### LONGEST STRUCTURE MOVED UNDER \$30,000

Laurie McCulloch Building Moving & Mechanical, Whitby, ON, Canada, moved this McKeen House, 42' W x 82' L, 800-1,000' on site in Port Hope, Ontario. Removal of radioactive waste soil required the temporary relocation. The move occurred in February 2003. The ground was frozen. Consequently McCulloch placed the building in the basement hole for the remainder of the winter and then jacked up the building to its proper foundation three months later when the basement hole had dried. **SM**
