# 2010 Awards Competition—Criteria & Rules

### **Method for Entering**

1. The Awards Committee is composed of three individuals in various areas of the country. A set of your entries, along with a set of every other entry received, will be furnished to each of the three judges. This is why it is necessary for you to provide three copies of each entry form along with three sets of 4x6 glossy color photographs for every entry submitted in each category you enter.
2. Email or CDs will NOT be acceptable for any entry. However, if you wish to also submit a CD of photos of each entry, fully identified, it would be helpful in the production of future issues of *Structural Mover* magazine.
3. Fully complete the requested information describing your entry. The information is necessary when describing the job when it appears in *Structural Mover* magazine.
4. Submit three (3) 4x6 glossy prints of each photograph with three (3) copies of each entry form **for every category** an entry is submitted.
5. Apply an identification label to the back of each photo instead of writing on it directly. Never use staples or paper clips.
6. Captions must be provided for each photograph submitted, including the name of your company and the name of the project.
7. Materials submitted become the property of IASM and may be used for association publicity material and in the *Structural Mover* magazine.
8. The 2010 annual conference will be February 10-14 at the Hilton Sandestin Beach Golf Resort & Spa in Destin, Florida. Consequently all entries must be received at the association offices in South Carolina by December 31, 2009 in order for winners to be determined and awards produced by the conference dates.

**All award applications must be received by 31 December 2009.  
Applications and photos sent to IASM via e-mail will NOT be accepted.**

## Award Applicant Criteria

1. The mover must have been a regular member in good standing during the year the job was performed and the year in which he is applying for the award, or have just retired since completing the job. The Awards Committee will check status against the current membership list.
2. The project must have been completed by December 31 of the year in which the competition is judged.
3. Retired movers are not eligible for awards except in the **Honor** category unless they retired in the year of application.
4. Members are only eligible for one award per company except: they may win one **Honor** category award **and** one award in the **Open** categories or the **Under \$30,000** categories.
5. Members may submit a project in more than one category. ***A duplicate application and duplicate photographs must be submitted for each category.***
6. At the discretion of the judges, award applications may be moved to categories other than the category for which they were submitted.

## Award Category Explanations

1. There are three basic categories of awards: • **Open** • **Under \$30,000** • **Honor**
2. The **Longest, Widest, Tallest, Heaviest Structure Moved** and **Heaviest Structure Moved on Rubber Tires** categories are judged strictly by the numbers (i.e. the Longest Structure qualifying in the Longest category wins).
3. The **Structure Moved the Greatest Distance on Land** may not include barge or rail travel as part of the total distance traveled. However, if a structure has been moved by rail or barge, the total excluding that amount is still eligible for this award.
4. The **Heaviest Building Moved** and the **Heaviest Building Moved On Rubber Tires** are discretionary categories and may be deleted at the discretion of the judges. These categories were created in case a ship, bridge, barge, or structure other than a building wins the **Heaviest Structure Moved Award**, potentially slighting a noteworthy building.
5. The **Structure Moved with the Most Square Footage on One Floor** may not be a combination of loads.
6. **Most Innovative Move Award.** Judges will look for innovation in method, equipment, or out-of-the-ordinary methods for solving unique problems.
7. **Best Time Saving Device Award.** The judges will look for a time/labor saving device which is unique and original.
8. **Judges Award.** This category is designed to honor the structural moving job which the judges consider either the best looking, best engineered, or most note-worthy job of the year. At the discretion of the judges, a job from another category may be placed into this category. It may have received an award in another category. If no entry is deemed worthy, the judges may choose not to make an award.
9. **Good Samaritan Award.** This award is presented to a member for assisting a fellow member and the industry without receiving personal benefit.
